



Friday, July 26th

Today we will visit Santarem for Mass at the Church of the Eucharistic Miracle, and venerate the "Bleeding Host". Continue on to visit Tomar going back to the days of Medieval Knights and the fortress and convent of the Knights Templar, later used by the Order of Christ. Return to Fatima for Lunch. In the evening, we will travel to a nearby restaurant for dinner.

Saturday, July 27th

Our trip today will be to Lisbon, the Capital of Portugal and Celebrate Mass at the birthplace of St. Anthony. We will also visit the 12th Century Cathedral where Saint Anthony was baptized. We will have special visits to Saint Jerome's Monastery, an outstanding example of Portuguese architecture and the Monument of the Expeditions, a very special place honoring the discoveries of the Portuguese and a connection to the Discovery of America. Enjoy our picnic lunch in the park. On our way back to Fatima, we will visit Óbidos, a fortified medieval city that was a Moorish stronghold before the 10th Century. In 1148, it was freed by Portugal's first king, and in 1228, it was given to Queen Isabella by her husband, King Dinis. It preserves all the unique characteristics. Dinner in Fatima at Domus Pacis.

Sunday, July 28th

Day in Fatima. Mass at the Basilica at 11:00. Remainder of day will be on your own. We have scheduled a Holy Hour at Domus Pacis Chapel at 6:30 with Benediction. After dinner Candlelight Procession at the Capelinha.

Monday, July 29th

Day in Fatima, our last day for shrine activities.

Tuesday, July 30th

Early Mass at Domus Pacis and breakfast before our bus departure to Lisbon and return flights home.

Wednesday, July 17th

Board United Airlines for our overnight flight to Lisbon.


Thursday, July 18th

Arrive in Lisbon. Board our Motor coach to Fatima.

Arrival at Domus Pacis for lunch and check-in. Our first Mass will be celebrated in the Chapel of the Apparitions. After dinner, we will participate in the candlelight procession in the Cova da Iria.

Friday, July 19th

After breakfast, we will visit the homes of the children in the village of Aljustrel and the area of Loco de Cabeco where the Angel gave communion to the children; Valinhos, where Our Lady appeared in August of 1917 after the children were released from prison. Celebrate Mass at the Fatima Parish Church where they were baptized. After lunch, time for personal activities. After dinner, participate in the candlelight procession.



Saturday, July 20th

Tour of Coimbra. One of the loveliest areas of Portugal, extremely important from a cultural and historical standpoint. We will visit the Church of the Holy Cross, with Manueline tombs of the first kings of Portugal, and a lovely sacristy with the statue of St. Anthony, who started his studies here as an Augustinian monk. Our picnic lunch will be in a beautiful park along the Mondego River. After lunch, we will visit the Carmelite Convent and museum where Sister Lucy was a cloistered nun and see her personal memorabilia. Our Mass will be offered in the Convent Chapel. Return to Fatima for dinner.

Sunday, July 21st

Day in Fatima. Mass is at 11:00 at the Basilica. After lunch the remainder of the day will be on your own. There will be the Solemn Eucharistic Procession in the late afternoon at the Basilica.

Monday, July 22nd

We will have a day in Fatima for devotions and other activities such as the Hungarian Stations of the Cross and celebrate Mass at the Chapel of St. Stephen.

Tuesday, July 23rd

We begin our journey over the plains of Spain to the walled city of Avila where St. Teresa was born in the year 1515. Mass will be offered in Alba de Tormes at her tomb. Here she established a convent in 1571 and later died on October 4, 1582. Arrive in Avila later in the day and check in to our hotel within the walls of the city.

Wednesday, July 24th

Our day will begin with Mass and visit to the Church of the Incarnation where Teresa entered the Carmelite Convent in November 1535 and professed in 1536. WE then travel to Segovia to the Monastery of Saint John of the Cross and celebrate our Mass. Return to Avila for dinner.

Thursday, July 25th

Morning Mass will be celebrated at St. Joseph's Convent Chapel, which was the first convent established by St. Teresa. We leave Avila to visit Salamanca where St Teresa established her convent in 1570. We visit the world renown Piazza, the University of Salamanca and the Great Cathedral of Salamanca. Our journey ends with dinner in Fatima.
